## A Future of Hope

How do we get into a situation where the difficulties around us lead us to despair? Or where the future holds no hope?

In **Romans 15:13**, Paul writes of a different perspective on life. "May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace as you trust in him, so that you may overflow with hope by the power of the Holy Spirit." The Greek word in this passage for *hope* (*elpidos*) means "desire of some good with expectation of obtaining it." Paul says that the Holy Spirit gives this kind of hope. A hope where we can look to the future positively in spite of the tragedy that might surround us.

So, if the Holy Spirit is willing to give us this positive hope, how is it that the world often wins out over God in our attitude or perspective? Paul gives us some clues in **I Timothy 4:6** where he mentions a characteristic of the "good servant of God." God's servant is "constantly nourished on the words of the faith and of the sound doctrine" which he or she has been following. This isn't a casual, or accidental feeding on the word of God, for Paul says in verses 7-8 that the good servant of God disciplines himself or herself for the purpose of godliness - that is, the servant of God takes his or her spiritual life seriously, investing time and energy to see that it grows strong.

We have a new year ahead of us. We can know the joy and peace of God in spite of what comes our way if we will take the time to get to know the God who wants to fill us with joy and peace. But as long as we hold on to the habits and thoughts of what this world says is important, God will not fill our hearts with His blessings. We cannot serve two masters (Matthew 6:24). We must be willing to let go of our trust in this life long enough to allow God to grow our faith and produce

in us a hope that leads to joy and peace. It is trust in God that leads to this overflowing of hope.

Here's what I'm planning to do so that I can be open to a year of hope in 2015. It begins with what might be called the "meat and potatoes" of spiritual health: reading the Bible and praying on a daily basis. Getting a reading schedule or a Bible organized for daily reading can be helpful. And for a bit of spiritual culinary delight, set aside time to watch two video presentations of the life of Christ. The Visual Bible – Matthew (Amazon: B0002UBX54) and The Gospel of John (Amazon: B0006Q93ZG) will draw you closer to Christ through a visual presentation of His life taken from these two gospels. Each can be viewed a few Bible chapters per sitting, or by setting aside a couple of hours to experience the whole message in each gospel.

Then on January 31<sup>st</sup> I hope to join each of you in a seminar where we will continue our journey to find our greater purpose in life. By looking at our own spiritual and personality gifts, we will find ways to actively pursue God's will according to the way He has prepared us. We will be taking the knowledge of God's Word that we are gaining, and combining that with daily application through the gifts God has given us. By trusting that God has a greater purpose for each of us, this year will be much more than we could have imagined in 2014.

We've exchanged holiday gifts and enjoyed all the holiday dinners. But the best part of the celebration continues into 2015 through the daily consideration of Christ's life, death and resurrection. As our faith grows and our trust in God with it, we can look for ways to make God's purpose a reality in our daily experiences. This is nourishment that God will bless, because the promise is that those who seek, will find. "Draw near to God and He will draw near to you" (James 4:8).
