

Faith Means Giving God Our Best

What determines the amount of effort we give? For some tasks we do just enough to get by, but for others we want to do our very best. What is considered important and unimportant is also not the same for all people. Some give their best to their job while others are simply doing enough for a paycheck. Some students strive for straight A's while others are content to just get to the next grade.

We see this in the Bible as well. Heb. 11:4 says that "by faith Abel offered to God a better sacrifice than Cain. . ." (NASB). While we do not know all the details of what God asked of them, we do have one important piece of information in Genesis that distinguishes the two brothers and their offerings.

The Bible says that Cain "brought an offering" while it states that Abel "brought of the firstlings of his flock and of their fat portions." (Gen 4:3-4 NASB). One major difference that we can see in the text is that Abel brought the best he had to God, but it appears that Cain did not. The other difference is that God had regard for Abel's sacrifice but not for Cain's.

What will you bring to God? As we gather to worship the perfect and holy Creator this morning, what kind of sacrifice of praise will you bring Him? Heb. 13:15 says that our sacrifice is the praise and thanksgiving we give to Him from our lips. Are you prepared to give Him the very best you can today (and every day)? How will God regard what we offer Him today?
