I am sure when my parents told me stuff like that I had that same crazy, "how did you ever live without indoor plumbing and electricity?" look on my face too. The new almost always is supposed to be an improvement on the old, isn't it? What happens when the new no longer works? Are we to go back to the old, the antiquated, and the old-fashioned? But the old is exactly what we may need right now. According to some researchers, an old cure is doing what new fangled antibiotics cannot. Commenting on a cure found in Bald's Leechbook for 10th century eye infections:
