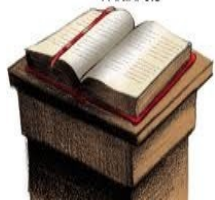

Did You Get Anything out of the Sermon?

Have you ever asked this question or answered it in the affirmative? We have all heard dry, boring, never-ending sermons. Years ago, I asked the question above of an older brother in the church. He challenged me, that in spite of how hard a particular preacher was to hear, to find one point from the sermon to remember. I have never forgotten that sage advice. You would also do well to heed it.

A couple of years ago, I preached a very convicting, toe-stepping sermon. It was not enjoyable to deliver (although necessary), nor was it enjoyable to hear. I could tell by the faces in the assembly that many were burdened by the message. However, one person came up to me at the door, as they did every week, and said, "I really enjoyed the sermon today." I was certain that this person was the only one who didn't get it.

The point is this: regardless of who the preacher is, **what you as the hearer put into the sermon will determine what you get out of it.** Phil Sanders wrote,

“The power of preaching has never been in the preacher; it has always been in the Scripture (I Cor. 1:21). It is the gospel message that has the power to save (Rom. 1:16; James 1:21), to cause one to be born again (I Pet. 1:23-25), and to give one an eternal inheritance (Acts 20:32). When the Scriptures are ignored, God is silenced.” (*Spiritual Sword*, Vol. 40, No. 1)

I work to bring biblical and practical lessons from the pulpit. Maybe sometimes I do better than others. However, the importance is not in how I did as much as in the message itself - for therein lies the power.

What will you put into the lessons this week?

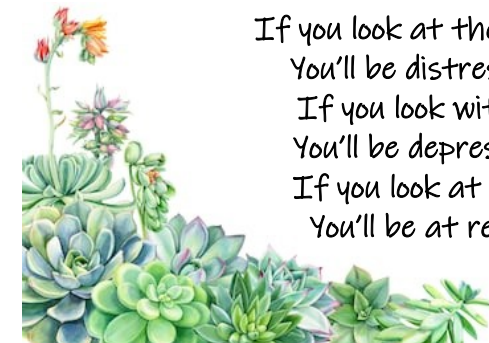
