### **Preparing for Worship - Part V**

In order to prepare for worship we must examine ourselves, correct our attitude, adjust our expectations and approach God in the proper manner. Finally, we must offer our best to the Lord.

In Malachi 1, Israel was condemned for offering defiled, blind, lame, and sick animals as sacrifices to the Lord. He responded, "I have no pleasure in you" (v. 10). In his commentary on this passage, Matthew Henry wrote these words:


If we worship God ignorantly, and without understanding, we bring the **blind** for sacrifice; If we do so carelessly, and without consideration, if we are cold, and dull, and dead, in it, we bring the **sick**; if we rest in the bodily exercise, and do not make heart-work of it, we bring the **lame**; and if we suffer vain thoughts and distractions to lodge within us, we bring the **torn**. And is this not evil? Is it not a great affront to God and a great wrong and injury to our own souls? For God, who is the best, ought to be served with the best we have. (Vol. 4, pg. 1166)

God deserves, even demands, the best we have to offer. Our worship must be the very best that we can give, and we have the solemn obligation to make sure that nothing becomes a barrier to our offering acceptable worship to God.

Did He not give His best for you?




