"The Only True God"

"And this is life eternal, that they might know thee the only true God, and Jesus Christ, whom thou hast sent" (John 17:3).



When Jesus prayed in the garden of Gethsemane, it was his desire that all

men come to know "the only true God." That can't be done through drawings or carvings or other images.

J.I. Packer quoted Calvin, who wrote:

A true image of God is not to be found in all the world; and hence...His glory is defiled, and His truth corrupted by the lie, whenever He is set before our eyes in a visible form...Therefore, to devise any image of God is itself impious; because by this corruption His majesty is adulterated, and He is figured to be other than He is.

Packer added, "The heart of objection to pictures and images is that they inevitably conceal most, if not all, of the truth about the personal nature and character of the divine Being whom they represent" (Knowing God, p. 40).

Little wonder God required his people to abstain from making such images (cf. Exodus 20:4).

Knowing the only true God is not the same as knowing some things about God, or even deducing

the very existence of God (cf. Psalms 19:1-4; Romans 1:18-25). Rather, it involves comprehending God's nature - his "Godhood" (Romans 1:20, KJV). For this, man requires a special revelation from God himself.

That special revelation is the Bible. There is no other source material. There are still boundless things about God that are outside the realm of nature and special revelation - "And these are but the outer fringe of his works; how faint the whisper we hear of him!" (Job 26:14a, NIV) - but what he has revealed to us through the Spirit will lead us to him (cf. 1 Corinthians 2:9-12; 2 Peter 1:19-21).

Jesus' incarnation served many purposes. One of them was to reveal the divine nature. As we look to him, we see the divine nature in bodily form (cf. Matthew 1:21; John 14:9; Colossians 2:9).




