### Love One Another

The Beatles once sang "all you need is love." Our world is filled with situations in which we would do well to demonstrate love to each other, but there is lots of confusion about what love really means. Many define it as an emotion that comes and goes like the wind, but is that really what love is?

Jesus gave His followers the command to "love one another, even as I have loved you" (Jn. 13:34 NASB95). If love is an emotion that comes and goes, then this is an impossible command. Our emotions are not reliable and we often struggle to control them. This is why the Bible teaches us not to be led by emotions. "There is a way which seems right to a man, but its end is the way of death" (Prov. 14:12). The love we read about in the Bible is far deeper than a fleeting emotion. Love is a decision, love is an action, and love is a commitment. Love can be (cont.)

This is why vows can be made in marriage to love for a lifetime – because love is far deeper than mere feelings. This is demonstrated clearly in the actions of God the Father and Jesus Christ. "But when the kindness of God our Savior and His love for mankind appeared, He saved us . . ." (Titus 3:4-5). The cross was not something Jesus looked forward to or particularly felt like going through, but He did it anyway because of His love.

Love for the Christian is much more than a feeling. It is a commitment to one another as members of the family of God. John wrote that we are to love "in deed and truth" (1 Jn. 3:18). In any group of people there are sometimes tensions and difficulties, but God calls us to commit to love one another in action.
