"For God So Loved..."

There are probably no more familiar words in the Bible than these. It has been said that these words are the "...burden of the entire body of divine revelation." All of Scripture either leads to or away from this stated fact.

The same love (*agape*) with which God so loved the world, is to be added to our faith (II Peter 5-7). Yet many do not understand what it means to love someone in this way. God's love for mankind is pure, spontaneous, and constant. Jesus did not die on the cross to compel God to love us, but because He already did. The cross was the result of God's love – not the cause of it.

It is God's desire that we learn to love in the same way He loved us – sacrificially, selflessly, constantly, changelessly. Through His example and His teachings, we can learn to love – in deed, not just in words. We are to love God with all of our being and our neighbor as ourselves (Matthew 22:36-40).

The third stanza in the song, "**The Love of God**," (# 133) well describes His love:

"Could we with ink the ocean fill, and were the skies of parchment made;
Were every stalk on earth a quill, and every man a scribe by trade;
To write the love of God above would drain the oceans dry;
Nor could the scroll contain the whole, tho' stretched from sky to sky."

Come, let us learn and grow together.
