## November 6, 2022

### God Can Use You Even If You Feel Unworthy

"I think I have done too many things wrong for God to accept me." This statement was made to me several years ago as I spoke to a friend who had left the church. In reflecting on his past decisions, this individual had determined that God was no longer interested in him. This was expressed as a result of this person's own poor decisions, but did not accurately reflect how God deals with sinners who come to Him.

After Jesus allowed Peter to catch an impossibly large number of fish, his immediate response was to fall at Jesus' feet and say "Go away from me, Lord; I am a sinful man!" (Luke 5:8, NIV). Peter realized that he was standing in the presence of someone who must have come from God. Rather than put Peter down for his sinfulness or unworthiness, Jesus invited Peter to join Him. "Don't be afraid; from now on you will fish for people" (Luke 5:10,

NIV). When Isaiah came into the presence of God and saw His majesty, he proclaimed "I am ruined! For I am a man of unclean lips..." (Is. 6:5, NIV). Rather than condemn Isaiah for his sin, God forgave and commissioned him to take a message to the people.

The first step to being a disciple of Jesus is humbly recognizing our need for Him (Matt. 5:3, NIV). It is these kind of people that God has used over and over again to do incredible things. Isaiah became a prophet who carried God's message. Peter preached on the day of Pentecost when 3,000 were saved from their sin. God used both of these imperfect men to do His work. He can use you too if you are humble and willing.
