God Can Use You for More Than You Think

We often have the tendency to place limitations on people (including ourselves) based on several criteria. We judge what people might be capable of based on education, family, their wealth (or lack), along with other things like this. If not careful, we can think the same way about church members (including self) and what their capability might be.

When Jesus selected His closest followers, the twelve apostles, He did not seek out the kind of men that would be expected. One would expect Jesus to find the best educated, outgoing, courageous, and gifted orators. Instead He selected men of various backgrounds such as fishermen, tax collectors, and a zealot. They often misunderstood Jesus' teachings and had to be corrected. Peter and John were even

observed to be "uneducated and untrained men." What was special about them was not any earthly qualification. It was that they had been with Jesus (Acts 4:13). These were men of faith who were determined to follow Jesus, and God used them to spread His message all over the planet. Because of God's work through ordinary men, we still believe and teach the message of Jesus today!

While we may struggle to think we are capable of being truly effective in carrying out God's mission, we need to be careful to not place limits on God. He works through us and continues to be with us as we follow Jesus today. You may wonder, "What could God possibly do through someone like me?" The Apostle Paul says that God can do more through you than you can even imagine (Eph. 3:20-21).

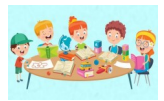
