

God Can Use You Regardless of Your Past

The past can haunt us if we allow ourselves to dwell on it too much. We sometimes struggle to forgive ourselves for past mistakes or still cringe over something we said in years past. When we think on these things, it can be easy to convince ourselves that there is too much bad in our past for God to use us for good today.

Some of God's greatest servants have been those with problematic pasts. Saul of Tarsus did all that he could to put an end to the church. He even went on a mission to Damascus to arrest Christians while "breathing threats and murder against the disciples of the Lord" (Acts 9:1, NASB). Instead of writing Saul off, God chose him to carry the gospel all over the Roman Empire. Saul's zeal for God was redirected


when he learned the truth about Jesus and he became a great missionary and the author of much of the New Testament. He would later write that the Lord put him into service although he "was formerly a blasphemer and a persecutor and a violent aggressor" (1 Tim. 1:12-13).

Regardless of what our past looks like, God is able to forgive and use us for His purposes. What we used to be is not nearly as important as what we become in Jesus Christ. God forgave and used Saul of Tarsus for His purpose. He can use each of us too if we will submit to Him.
